

A Historic Weekend in Cape Girardeau, MO

Friday

Saturday

Morning **Bollinger Mill State Historic Site** is home to a Civil War era four-story mill. Walk across the covered bridge (one of only four remaining in the state) stretching over the Whitewater River, tour the mill, picnic on the grounds along the water and hike to the Bollinger Family Cemetery.

Afternoon The **Cape River Heritage Museum** is located in an old fire station and is packed with thoughtful exhibits illustrating life in Cape Girardeau, from the start of the community to the age of the steamboats and beyond.

Archaeology, history and fine art are beautifully represented throughout **Crisp Museum's** collections of Native American pottery, an art gallery and exhibits detailing life along the Mississippi River over the years.

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Sunday

- Morning Experience the Civil War in Cape Girardeau at Fort D, an earthenworks fort that defended Cape Girardeau from Confederate forces. Follow the Civil War Driving Tour (download it at VisitCape.com/BackinTime) and get a feel for the divided community Cape Girardeau was during the Civil War. Hours: Daily. - Afternoon Experience the life of a well-to-do Cape Girardeau family during the Victorian Era at the beautifully restored **Glenn House**, where you'll find cutting-edge 19th century tech and period furnishings. **Hours:** May-Oct., Sat.-Sun. 1-4 p.m. **Address:** 325 S. Only 11 miles north of Cape Girardeau's downtown, **Trail of Tears State Park** features some of Missouri's most breathtaking scenery. A fully accessible overlook with stunning views of the Mississippi River, trails, a swimming beach and a visitors center provide an afternoon of fun and adventure for those interested in history and the great outdoors.
